# The planning committee obtained the following data from service providers and IES sponsors, showing the impact of IES since 2009:

- As of October 1, 2010, there were over 86 new companies that were formed in Iowa by IES attendees;
- As of November 1, 2010, out of the 86 new companies, **78** of them established company bank accounts with IES sponsors US Bank, Wells Fargo Bank and Bankers Trust.
- Out of the 86 new companies, at least 52 new jobs were created and about 39 of the businesses obtained professional services from companies that were sponsors of IES.
- At the 2010 IES, about **140** attendees had also attended the 2009 IES, and about **65** had attended the 2008 IES.
- Since 2008, IES has been attended by over **700** attendees who are originated from **49** countries. Since August 1, 2010, IES website has been visited by over **500** people.
- The IES was attended by 425 people in 2010, 350 in 2009, and 300 in 2008.

We are excited that IES has become an economic phenomenon. Watch us grow, or, better yet, join us.
